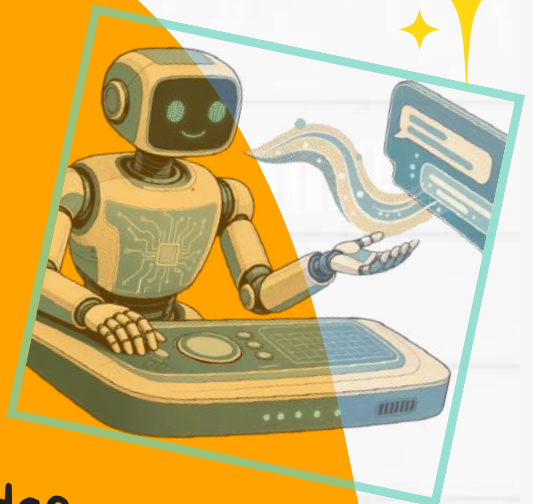
**One Nation, Many Cultures**
